Tyteanna Wilson – age 26 – Florence, AZ

7. Circumstances of the fatality that indicate it was the result of abuse or neglect:

On July 17, 2021, the Department of Child Safety received a report regarding one-year-old, Aniyah Wilson, who was found unresponsive in the bed next to her mother, Tyteanna Wilson. The Department filed a dependency petition through Pinal County Superior Court on July 21, 2021. The court found that the mother, Tyteanna Wilson, was unable to parent due to neglect on August 17, 2021. The autopsy later revealed that Aniyah died as a result of Fentanyl toxicity.

8. Whether DCS has received any reports or past cases, of child abuse, abandonment or neglect involving the child or the current alleged perpetrator(s):**

DCS received the following prior report involving Tyteanna Wilson and Aniyah Wilson:

On May 20, 2021, a report was received alleging neglect to Aniyah and other children by her mother, Tyteanna Wilson, and another adult in the home. The investigation was still pending when the fatality report was received.

9. Actions taken by DCS in response to the fatality:

A joint investigation was conducted with the Pinal County Sheriff's Office

10. Actions taken regarding the child and/or other children in the home:

Following an assessment of child safety, some of the other children in the home were placed with relatives and one child was placed with their other parent.

11. Whether the agency is or intends to provide direct services or service referrals to the family:

The Department is providing services to the family including services to support the other children involved.
