

Summary Report	Fatality	11/04/2024
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1. Victim: Roman Burke – 5-year old male

2. Was the child residing in the child's home or in an out-of-home placement at the time of the fatality?

The child was residing in his home when the following incident occurred:

On April 15, 2023, the Department of Child Safety received a report regarding 5-year-old Roman Burke, who had been involved in a motor vehicle crash. The child was unrestrained in a vehicle when it was rear-ended by a SUV. The child was transported to the hospital, where he was pronounced deceased. The Department substantiated the allegations of physical abuse and neglect by Michael Burke, who drove intoxicated with the child unrestrained in an all-terrain vehicle.

3. If the victim in the Preliminary Report involved a child residing in the child's home, the following information will be provided:

a. Services being provided to the child, a member of the child's family or the person suspected of the abuse or neglect at the time of the incident and the date of the last contact before the incident between the entity providing services and the person receiving services:

There were no services being provided to the family by the Department of Child Safety at the time of the incident.

b. Was the child, a member of the child's family or the person suspected of the abuse or neglect the subject of a report for investigation at the time of the incident?

c. All involvement of the child's parents and of the person suspected of the abuse or neglect in a situation for which a report for investigation was made or in services provided pursuant to this chapter in the five years preceding the incident:

The child's mother was involved in the following prior report:

On April 14, 2018, a report was received alleging neglect to Roman by his mother. The investigation assessed Roman as safe with his parents under a safety plan. The family accepted in-home services. The family successfully completed services and the case was closed on August 13, 2018. The allegation of neglect by the mother was substantiated.

d. Any investigation pursuant to a report for investigation concerning the child, a member of the child's family or the person suspected of the abuse or neglect or

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services provided to the child or the child's family since the date of the incident involving the fatality:

The investigation of the fatality report resulted in the sibling being assessed as safe with their parents with an in-home safety plan. The family successfully completed the services. The safety plan was lifted and the case closed on October 31, 2023. The allegations of neglect and physical abuse pertaining to Michael Burke has been substantiated.

A subsequent report involving a parent and sibling was received on April 13, 2024, regarding allegations of neglect. The child was assessed as safe and the allegation was unsubstantiated. The case was closed on May 9, 2024.

The Department conducted a joint investigation with the Fort Mojave Tribal Police Department. Following an assessment of child safety, the sibling was assessed as safe with their parents with an in-home safety plan. The family successfully completed the services. The safety plan was lifted and the case closed on October 31, 2023. The allegations of neglect and physical abuse pertaining to Michael Burke has been substantiated. A subsequent report involving a parent and sibling was received on April 13, 2024, regarding allegations of neglect. The child was assessed as safe and the allegation was unsubstantiated. The case was closed on May 9, 2024.

Additionally, in accordance with the DCS Strategic Plan for State Fiscal Year 2016 (FY16), multidisciplinary team (MDT) reviews of fatality and near fatality cases were implemented during the first quarter of FY16. The MDT reviews fatality and near fatality cases with prior DCS involvement, which are a key feature of the Strategic Plan and supports the objective of increasing the accuracy of safety and risk assessments in investigations.

Cases are reviewed by the MDT in order to identify any systemic factors, both internal and external to the Department that may have had an impact. The Department uses the aggregate data gathered through all of the MDT reviews to assess and guide future changes and/or recommendations to policies, practices, rules or statutes. Findings from these reviews are compiled into an annual report to be shared on the DCS website. The target date for release of the next report is December 1, 2024.
