- **1. Victim:** Selma Felix- 3-year-old female
- 2. Was the child residing in the child's home or in an out-of-home placement at the time of the fatality?

The child was residing in her home when the following incident occurred:

On December 2, 2023, the Department of Child Safety received a report regarding 3-year-old female, Selma Felix, being found unresponsive after ingesting fentanyl in the home while in the care of her mother, Alyssa Felix. Selma was taken to the hospital where she was pronounced deceased. On April 16, 2024, the Maricopa County Superior Court found that the mother, Alyssa Felix, neglected the child.

- 3. If the victim in the Preliminary Report involved a child residing in the child's home, the following information will be provided:
 - a. Services being provided to the child, a member of the child's family or the person suspected of the abuse or neglect at the time of the incident and the date of the last contact before the incident between the entity providing services and the person receiving services:

There were no services being provided to the family by the Department of Child Safety at the time of the incident.

b. Was the child, a member of the child's family or the person suspected of the abuse or neglect the subject of a report for investigation at the time of the incident?

c. All involvement of the child's parents and of the person suspected of the abuse or neglect in a situation for which a report for investigation was made or in services provided pursuant to this chapter in the five years preceding the incident:

DCS received the following prior reports involving Alyssa Felix and/or Selma Felix:

On July 14, 2015, a report was received alleging neglect to a child by Alyssa Felix. The allegations were substantiated and the family was referred for and completed services with the Department. The case was closed on January 7, 2016.

On February 26, 2020, a report was received alleging neglect to Selma Felix and her siblings by their mother, Alyssa Felix. Following an assessment of child safety, a

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dependency petition was filed with the Maricopa County Superior Court for all the children and the family was referred for services. The mother engaged in recommended services and the children were assessed as safe in her care. The dependency was dismissed on January 13, 2021, and the allegations were unsubstantiated as to Ms. Felix. The Department remained involved with the family until the cased closed in April 2021.

d. Any investigation pursuant to a report for investigation concerning the child, a member of the child's family or the person suspected of the abuse or neglect or services provided to the child or the child's family since the date of the incident involving the fatality:

The investigation of the fatality resulted in the other children in the home being removed and placed with a relative. The Department filed a dependency petition with the Maricopa County Juvenile Court regarding the siblings and services are being provided to the family. On April 16, 2024, the Maricopa County Superior Court found that the mother, Alyssa Felix, neglected Selma and her siblings. No subsequent reports of abuse or neglect were received regarding the family.

5. Actions taken by the Department in response to the case including any changes to policy or practice and/or recommendations for further changes in policies, practices, rules or statutes:

The Department conducted a joint investigation with the Phoenix Police Department. The investigation of the fatality resulted in the other children in the home being removed and placed with a relative. The Department filed a dependency petition with the Maricopa County Juvenile Court regarding the siblings and services are being provided to the family. On April 16, 2024, the Maricopa County Superior Court found that the mother, Alyssa Felix, neglected Selma and her siblings. No subsequent reports of abuse or neglect were received regarding the family.

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Additionally, in accordance with the DCS Strategic Plan for State Fiscal Year 2016 (FY16), multidisciplinary team (MDT) reviews of fatality and near fatality cases were implemented during the first quarter of FY16. The MDT reviews fatality and near fatality cases with prior DCS involvement, which are a key feature of the Strategic Plan and supports the objective of increasing the accuracy of safety and risk assessments in investigations.

Cases are reviewed by the MDT in order to identify any systemic factors, both internal and external to the Department that may have had an impact. The Department uses the aggregate data gathered through all of the MDT reviews to assess and guide future changes and/or recommendations to policies, practices, rules or statutes. Findings from these reviews are compiled into an annual report to be shared on the DCS website. The target date for release of the next report is December 1, 2024.
