A Fatality/Near Fatality Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) reviewed the case and determined that the investigation was handled appropriately and the safety of the children was addressed by the repair of the gates and doors leading to the pool. The review also determined the family was offered sufficient services to address their needs and no further intervention was needed. The incident was preventable if the child had adequate supervision. The Department reminds all caregivers to always watch children around water and follow the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) Pool Safety Recommendations.
