DCS Bill

SB 1351 - child safety; neglect; definition

Modifies the definition of "neglect" to allow a determination that a newborn infant was exposed prenatally to a drug or controlled substance by a toxicology screen.

Got off to a rocky start and never recovered.



SB 1236 - adult adoption; stepchildren

Emergency measure that permits an adult to adopt another adult person who is a current or previous stepchild.

- Sponsor: Senator Gowan
- Signed by the Governor



SB 1523 (Chapter 4) mental health omnibus

- Adds a new chapter relating to Insurance that requires each health care insurer to comply with the federal Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act.
- Health Care Insurers- Cannot deny mental health or substance use disorder benefits for a minor solely on the grounds that the service was provided in an educational setting or ordered by a court.
- Mental Health Parity Advisory Committee- Established to advise on matters relating to mental health.
- Suicide Mortality Review Team-Established in DHS to develop a suicide mortalities data collection system.
- Children's Behavioral Health Services Fund Established to be administered by AHCCCS for children's behavioral health services.
- AHCCCS- Required to conduct a survey of public schools to obtain information regarding the delivery of behavioral health services to students.



SB 1441 - (Chapter 81) protection orders; modification; residence possession

Authorizes the court, on written request of a party, to hold additional order of protection hearings at any time if there is a change in circumstances related to the primary residence.

- Sponsor: Senator E. Farnsworth
- Signed by the Governor



HB 2904/SB 1687- (Chapter 53) budget; BRB; human services; 2020-2021

Requires the Auditor General to provide a report regarding DCS's practices for classifying and locating runaway or missing children.

- Report due September 30, 2021
- Sponsor: Speaker Bowers
- Signed by the Governor



HB 2909/SB 1692- (Chapter 58) budget; general appropriations act; 2020-2021

Appropriates \$4,992,800 from the automation projects fund for deposit in the DCS subaccount to upgrade the children's information library and data source system.
