Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Login - FAFSA on the Web - Federal Student Aid

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to apply for federal student financial aid and is processed at no cost to the applicant. It is used to determine a student's eligibility for federal grant, loan, and work funds.

Arizona Department of Child Safety – Education Training Voucher (ETV)

Foster Success- Arizona

The Arizona Education and Training Voucher (ETV) Program is a federally-funded, stateadministered program which can provide youth who are or were in U.S. foster care with funding for post-secondary education. Youth who were in foster care, adopted or who entered permanent guardianship on or after their 16th birthday qualify for ETV. You must attend an accredited college, university, technical or vocational school.

Arizona Department of Child Safety – Tuition Waiver (TW)

Foster Success- Arizona

The Arizona Tuition Waiver is available to youth who spent time in foster care at age 14 and older. It is available to students attending Arizona public community colleges or four-year colleges and universities.

Arizona Friends of Foster Children Foundation

<u>Scholarship Guidelines | Arizona Friends of Foster Children Foundation (affcf.org)</u> The foundation offers scholarships to current or former foster youth who have experienced foster care up until their 18th birthday. Scholarships are available for a total commitment of 10 semesters. <u>DUE DATE: PRIOR TO START OF EACH SEMESTER</u>

The <u>AFFCF Focus Forward Fund</u> is designed to help young adults who have aged out of foster care overcome emergency expenses that derail their post-secondary education. These funds are not intended to be used for long-term, ongoing expenses. To receive assistance, youth must be: 1) in foster care or aged out of foster care in Arizona, 2) ages 18 years and up until youth's 27th birthday, and 3) enrolled at a university/college, community college, or a vocational school/program.

The Focus Forward Fund offers up to \$2500 per semester to help cover vocational and trade school tuition and fees. They also have an award for up to \$500 per semester for books, up to \$500 for vocational training supplies, and up to \$1000 one-time award for a laptop. Additional eligibility requirements may apply.

Arizona Community Foundation Scholarships

Arizona Community Foundation

The Arizona Community Foundation (ACF) is the largest private provider of scholarships in Arizona. With one application, students gain access to over 100 scholarship opportunities online. **Several are specific to students who have spent time in foster care**. Some awards are given based on merit or financial need, while others are awarded to students in a particular geographic region or with specific demographic characteristics. Applicants are automatically matched with every scholarship opportunity for which they qualify. High school seniors, current post-secondary students and graduate-level students attending schools across the nation are eligible. **Applications open on January 1st and some close as early as March**

Youth must be an Arizona resident and U.S. Citizen/eligible non-resident. Must be in DCS Extended Foster Care (EFC) Program. Youth must live on campus while attending GCU to qualify.

Dorrance Scholarship Programs

Dorrance Scholarship Programs

The Dorrance Scholarship is for first-generation students and is a need-based award. It provides financial and academic support for Arizona high-school graduates pursuing an undergraduate degree at one of Arizona's public universities. The award is renewable for four years of funding. Scholarships renew based on academic standing, participation in program events and activities, and community service projects.

Eligibility Requirements: (Must meet ALL of the following requirements):

- Current seniors who will graduate from an accredited Arizona high school and enter the university as a college freshman
- First generation to attend college (neither parent/step-parent or legal guardian holds a four-year degree)
- Minimum cumulative 3.00 GPA (weighted or unweighted)
- Have a minimum test score of 1110 SAT, 22 ACT, or 72 CLT
- Admitted to one of Arizona's three (3) public universities
- Demonstrated financial need as determined by the FAFSA
- Agree to participate in all aspects of the scholarship program
- Reside on campus freshman and sophomore year and successfully complete the Summer Bridge Program

The Community Foundation for Southern Arizona offers a wide variety of scholarship opportunities for students. Graduates from high schools outside of this region will not be considered for this scholarship.

The Flinn Scholarship

Flinn Foundation

The Flinn Scholarship is a competitive, merit-based scholarship for Arizona high-school seniors.

To be awarded the Flinn Scholarship, an applicant must:

- Be a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident (Green Card holder) by time of application;
- Be an Arizona resident for two full years immediately preceding entry to the university.

As a general rule, Flinn Scholarship applicants should also:

- Attain at least a 3.5 grade-point average (unweighted);
- Rank in the top 5 percent of their graduating class (if the school reports class rank); and
- Participate and demonstrate leadership in a variety of extracurricular activities.
- Flinn Scholarship applicants must submit SAT or ACT scores, but there is no minimum score needed to apply.

Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona Vocational Grant

TRVFA Vocational Grant

To be eligible to apply for a TRVFA vocational education grant, the applicant must:

- Be a resident of the State of Arizona
- Have estimated current-year household income equal to or less than 150% of the published poverty level. If the applicant files jointly or is a dependent on someone else's tax return, the full household size and estimated current-year income must be stated.
- Attend a postsecondary school/training institution in Arizona to obtain vocational training which can be completed in two years or less.
- NOT have already earned a college degree.
- Our current maximum one-time grant is \$2,000. If the cost of the program is less than \$2,000, we will not fund more than the cost. Allowed costs include: Tuition, Books, Fees, Tools, Uniforms, Other items required to get certification

Arizona Western College Scholarships

Arizona Western College (AWC) offers a variety of scholarships that are open to all students. AWC also offers program-, local-, ethnic-, and gender-specific scholarships. AWC also offers Foundation Scholarships and Institutional Scholarships. Armstrong Family Foundation Scholarship (ASU)

Armstrong Scholarship

The Armstrong Family Foundation Scholarship is offered through the Arizona State University Foundation. The Scholarship awards up to \$10,000 a year. Students must be an orphan, a ward of the court, in foster care or a qualified independent student. Students must be a full-time incoming freshman, freshman, or sophomore, attending one of the ASU campuses (Tempe, Downtown Phoenix, Polytechnic, West). Students must also be an Arizona resident and a US citizen or lawful legal resident of the US with a 3.0 GPA.

Blavin Scholars Program

Blavin Scholars Program | Blavin Scholars Program (nau.edu)

The Blavin Scholars Program assists Northern Arizona University undergraduate students who have been a part of the foster care system. Students who are Arizona residents seeking an undergraduate degree and who have demonstrated financial need and experience in the foster care system are eligible for this scholarship. Full-time enrollment is required. See website for more information.

Champions Scholarship

The Champions Scholarship is one of many scholarships offered under the Yavapai College Foundation Scholarships. Students eligible for the Champions Scholarship must be a current or recent ward of the Yavapai County Juvenile Court. The Scholarship is available at both the Verde and Prescott Campuses. Scholarships cover costs for tuition, books and fees for full or part-time students enrolled in a degree or certificate program. Deadlines are: May 15th for the Fall semester (March 1st for priority deadline) and November 30th for the Spring semester (November 1st for priority deadline). Helping Hands for Single Moms Scholarship Program (thecollegemonk.com)

The helping hands scholarship assists single moms in obtaining a college education and financial independence. Eligibility Criteria include:

- Have US Citizenship and reside in Maricopa County/the Phoenix-Metro Valley
- Be legally single/divorced and may not reside with a domestic partner
- Registered in college (or, if a nursing student, be on a waiting list). It is recommended that students apply after completion of their first semester (of nine credits or more).
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher
- Carry minimum of 9 credit hours per semester
- Have at least one child under age 11 living with you
- Attend and participate in the regularly scheduled meetings
- Be a responsible and responsive program participant

John Likins Memorial Scholarship

Pima Community College Merit Scholarship

PCC Institutional Scholarships (Tucson, AZ)

The Pima Merit Scholarship is awarded to Pima County residents that have recently graduated from a Pima County high school or have completed their GED. Eligible applicants must have graduated with an unweighted GPA of 3.5 or higher or completed their GED with an average test score of 165 or higher. Applicants must be eligible for general (in-state) tuition and have not already received another tuition waiver or similar form of aid. Students must be enrolled at Pima for the fall semester immediately following high school graduation. President Barack Obama Scholars (ASU)

President Barack Obama Scholars Program | ASU Students | ASU

ASU will consider all full-time freshman admitted directly from an Arizona high school. Eligible students will be notified by the Student Financial Assistance Office. Students just need to apply to ASU, file their FAFSA, and the student will automatically be considered for this award. ASU will cover the estimated direct costs for eight consecutive semesters. Covered costs include tuition, fees, room, board and books. Scholars also have the opportunity to participate in a mentoring program. Application for ASU admission and the FAFSA must be received by January 15th

Pinal Promise Scholarship

Pinal Promise Program - Central Arizona College (centralaz.edu)

The Pinal Promise educational initiative was launched in 2001 by a caring community that believed that college should be a reality for every Pinal County student. This program was developed to encourage young people to stay in high school, graduate, and move on to a college or university.

Eligible student must:

- Reside and graduate from a Pinal County high school (online high schools must have a physical presence in Pinal County).
- Participate in 20 hours of community service that can be completed in high school or while attending CAC.

(UofA) Wildcat Excellence Award

Incoming First-Year and Transfer Tuition Scholarship Awards | Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid (arizona.edu)

Initial first-year merit tuition scholarship offers are based on self-reported grades provided by the student at the time of admission. The scholarship award offers become final and cannot be appealed after the admissions grade verification is complete.

GPA calculated is based on your core unweighted high school GPA through your sixth semester. To be eligible, students must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. The Resident Wildcat Awards also require that the student be classified as an Arizona resident for tuition purposes. The Non-Resident Arizona Awards require that the student be classified as a non-Arizona resident for tuition purposes.

National Scholars receive awards of \$20,000 for college. Regional Scholars receive awards of \$10,000 for college. Graduating seniors planning to pursue a degree at an accredited U.S. postsecondary institution and carrying a minimum 3.0 GPA at the end of their junior year of high school, are eligible to apply. Semifinalists are notified in mid-November and must then complete a secondary application, including essays, official transcripts, and two letters of recommendation. EEQUAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM

EEQUAL SCHOLARSHIP

The program itself is designed to highlight the incredible potential of young people in the United States who are struggling with homelessness, housing instability, or extreme poverty. This scholarship covers tuition costs up to \$8,000 for four-year colleges or universities (Bachelor's Degree), junior or community colleges (Associate's Degree), career colleges (Trade or Vocational), and online degree programs. Students are eligible to apply if they are experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity (as defined under the McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children and Youth Program (MV) students in extreme poverty; or students whose family is currently going through a transition). Please note: This is not an honorary scholarship for students who have experienced homelessness or extreme poverty in the past and overcame their situation. EEqual is looking to support students who are currently struggling and are in need.

Foster Care to Success / Casey Family Scholars Program

Foster Care to Success | Casey Family Scholars (fc2success.org)

The Casey Family Scholars Program is administered by FC2S. Awards range from \$1,500 to \$5,000 per academic year and are renewable for up to five (5) years if a student remains eligible. Applicants must have been in foster care for the 12 consecutive months prior to their 18th birthday OR adopted or placed into legal guardianship from foster care after their 16th birthday; and be under the age of 25 on March 31st of the year in which they first apply and have been accepted into or expect to be accepted into an accredited, Pell-eligible college or other post-secondary school. Provides scholarships to youth who have experienced homelessness to ensure their completion of a post-secondary education program. Assists youth with financial aid processes, mental health advocacy and referrals. The scholarship is a \$2,500 award. The application is for those who will begin college (four year, community college, or trade school) for the first time (not including dualenrollment courses). Applicants who have experienced homelessness within the last six (6) years are eligible to apply. Undocumented students who meet these criteria are eligible. The Shawn Carter Scholarship Fund (SCSF) was founded on the belief that any motivated individual in need should have the opportunity to further his or her education. The All-Star Scholarship is open to children adopted at or after the age of 13 (or who have exited foster care to permanent guardianship) to provide increased opportunities for advanced education. Each year, one student will be selected to receive the scholarship. This student will be eligible to receive up to \$10,000 annually to go towards tuition, books, and other college-related expenses. Scholarship recipients are paired with an MLB umpire and their family, who mentor these students through their college years.

The National Scholarship Award will cover your tuition and fees up to a maximum of \$16,500 for an associate degree and \$33,000 for a bachelor's degree, at one of our Partner Colleges. Please note, some scholars may be eligible for an additional stipend of up to \$6,000 for books, supplies, and transportation. While we consider your GPA, we place great emphasis on your dedication to community service and your commitment to academic and career success despite the barriers and challenges that undocumented students face daily. The award follows students through the completion of a bachelor's degree and is renewable each year – Recipients must meet the continuing eligibility criteria and renew the award each summer. Application opens November 1st and closes February 28th. Applications are open to undocumented immigrant students with or without DACA or TPS who came to the U.S. before the age of 16 and before Nov. 1, 2017.

Golden Door Scholarship

Golden Door Scholarship Application

Golden Door Scholars is an organization that provides large college scholarships, career and fellowship support, mentorship, and community-building opportunities for undocumented students.

The AZ tuition waiver is available at any of the state-funded universities (NAU, ASU, and U of A) and all the state community colleges for <u>eligible</u> youth who experienced foster care in Arizona. The school determines how and when the waiver can be applied. This waiver can only be used for eligible tuition and fees and does not waive any costs for housing, books, meal plan, etc. This program is only available to students until their 23rd birthday.

Who Qualifies?

- Student must be a current or former foster youth who was in U.S. foster care on or after their 14th birthday OR
- Was adopted from U.S. foster care with the adoption finalized after their 14th birthday
- Student must be a U.S. citizen or qualified non-citizen
- Personal assets (bank account, car, home, etc.) are not over \$10,000
- Has completed a FAFSA application
- Is attending a public AZ college or university (UofA, NAU, ASU, various community colleges)
- Remains in good standing and be progressing toward earning a credential with the university or community college

The application for the Arizona Tuition Waiver is part of the ETV application. DCS will determine if you are eligible for the program and your school will decide if they will apply it to your financial aid package.
