DCS Legislative Agenda 2021



House Bill 2332 - aggravated assault; DCS employees

- Adds DCS workers to the list of first responders that would qualify for protections under the aggravated assault statute.
- Prevents the targeted attacks of DCS workers' health and safety by expanding the definition of aggravated assault to include a DCS employee who is assaulted while engaged in the execution of any official duties.



House Bill 2399 - department of child safety; fees

- Allows the Department to establish and collect fees from noncontracting licensees and establishes the Child Welfare Licensing Fee Fund (Fund).
- Licensees that do not contract with Arizona, that contract with the federal government, that receive only federal monies and that employ persons who provide direct services to children in a licensed behavioral health residential facility must submit to DCS information necessary to conduct central registry background checks (A.R.S. § 8-804).
- Currently, Arizona citizens are paying for the cost of the central registry checks for noncontracting licensees that was not allocated for noncontracting licensees because these entities are federally contracted. This legislation would require these licensees to pay for the cost of their central registry checks. In addition, in the future if these facilities opts to become licensed by AZ DCS is would ensure that Arizona tax payers are not required to should the financial responsibility of their entities.
